# Subject: Unified Support for Colorado's Wolf Restoration Program

Dear Members of the Joint Budget Committee,

On behalf of the undersigned Non-Governmental Organizations, representing hundreds of thousands of Colorado residents, we urge you to maintain full funding for Colorado Parks and Wildlife's wolf restoration program. Cutting funds at this critical juncture would not only contradict the will of Colorado voters but would also prove fiscally and biologically irresponsible.

# Fiscal Responsibility:

- Colorado has already invested significant resources in planning, public outreach, and initial wolf releases. Cutting funding now would waste these investments and potentially require even greater expenditures in the future to restart the program.
- Colorado Parks & Wildlife designed the current program for cost-effectiveness, leveraging existing resources and partnerships.

#### **Voter Mandate:**

- Voters mandated Colorado's wolf restoration program, a fact that underscores the need for careful legislative stewardship to ensure success.
- Defunding the program would undermine democratic principles and erode public trust in government responsiveness.

## **Progress to Date:**

- CPW has successfully released the first of several waves of wolves, with the next wave soon on deck.
- Comprehensive conflict minimization programs are in place, including the new Range Rider program.

### **Scientific Necessity:**

 Continued releases are essential to reach the 150-200 wolves needed for a self-sustaining population. Ongoing translocation bolsters genetic diversity, crucial for long-term viability.

We respectfully ask that you honor Colorado voters' wishes and maintain fiscal responsibility by fully funding the wolf restoration program. This initiative represents Colorado's commitment to conservation, democratic values, and sound fiscal management.
